Garden on the Hill Update

The 2015 Garden on the Hill has been put to rest for the winter. Much was accomplished on our October 31st workday: raspberries cut back, all beds weeded and cleaned out—some topped off with new soil—and the aisles between the beds weeded and mulched. A few herbs and some kale were left to winter over. The weather was perfect

and the company most congenial.

This was our 5th year growing vegetables and herbs in raised beds on the hill. Except for our disappointing tomatoes and squash, the garden again produced everything green beans to African Gem Squash and much in between. Our primary purpose has always been to donate a significant part of our produce to ACTC and GEDCO. This year

we made weekly trips to one or both of these food pantries plus we had some to share with the congregation on numerous Sundays.

When we originally envisioned this project, we hoped to engage others in the community in planting and caring for the garden. In our first year, we worked with some of the Boy Scouts and helped them earn a Gardening Badge. We also helped the Week Day School start a little garden. During the past five years a collaborative

partnership has evolved in which we each befit from the sharing of ideas, information, and labor. Because of the dedication of the director and her teachers. the school's garden is now a fanciful place where the children can observe plant and insect life up close.

Winter is a good time to imagine trying some new

things. You never know what can happen in a garden.
